#### **Special Aspects**

Weather conditions leading up to count day brought us heavy winds and rain, flooded fields, snow and arctic air, then a few mild days and rain for count day. Overall waterfowl, diver and dabbler numbers seem lower this year. Viewing conditions were challenging due to choppy seas and rain which also kept our owls and forest birds well hidden. There were very few finches seen but a broad assortment of our seed eaters were present. Brant arrived mid-November, early again, their numbers about the same as last year. Trumpeter Swan numbers have increased over the last 27 years but were unexpectedly low this time (320), however over 705 were seen on Dec13 during pre-count scouting at 3 sites within the count circle. Other species with lower than usual counts: Canada Goose, scaup, Great-blue Heron, all woodpeckers, Brown Creeper, Varied Thrush, all finches. Highlights include: Greater White-fronted Goose, Brant, Cackling Goose, Gadwall, Northern Shoveler, Ring-necked Pheasant, Yellow-billed Loon, Northern Goshawk, Greater Yellowlegs, Surfbird, Sanderling, 9099 gulls, Mourning Dove, 164 Anna's Hummingbirds, hybrid Red-naped x Red-breasted Sapsucker, Kestrel, Merlin, Peregrine, Northern Shrike, Hutton's Vireo, American Dipper, American Pipit, Palm Warbler, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Townsend's Warbler, Savannah Sparrow, Lincoln's Sparrow, 7 Western Meadowlark, Brown-headed Cowbird, Pine Grosbeak, Red and White-winged Crossbills, Common Redpoll, American Goldfinch, Evening Grosbeak. Most of our 9 cw species were seen several times before and after count day by multiple observers. We had 102 participants, 52 in the field and 50 at feeders, plus 10 more who helped with set up and breakdown of the popular Post Count Potluck sponsored by the Arrowsmith Naturalists.
